Personally. And then, how will it continue to change your life today, tomorrow and forever.



The time has come that we need every member not only to pray but financially, physically find any way they can to keep our church going. Everyone of you who say you are a member of Immanuel Trinity we need your help. Please ask God to make you generous. Remember God Loves you.

WELCA NEWS

In April we had a Mission Moment telling about the Ministry of the Personal Care kits. These are put together here and shipped to Lutheran World Relief for use throughout the world. LWR gets requests for the kits and quilts and ships them where they are most needed. We work on the kits throughout the year and quilting takes place the 3rd Wednesday of each month. We send them all every October. LWR has warehouses where kits and quilts are stored – one in Minnesota and one in Maryland – until they are needed, usually within 6 months. LWR works only with experienced, reputable agencies that can manage large volumes of humanitarian aid items.

If you would like to help with this ministry, you can purchase supplies any time of the year or there are special envelopes on which you can designate where you want the donation to be used – for supplies or for shipping of those items. The envelopes are on the table next to the mailboxes in the hall and can be used any time throughout the year. If you'd like to help with quilts, we can use people to come tie and sew quilts, or if you want to you can sew them at home.

Personal Care Kits include:

- 1 towel – dark in color 20" x 40" up to 52" x 27"
- 2 bath size bars of soap in the original wrappers
- 1 adult size toothbrush in original packaging
- 1 sturdy comb
- 1 metal nail clipper



Quilting supplies include:

- Washable material – no religious, flag, patriotic, camouflage, military symbols
- Old sheets or table cloths
- Thread

Shipping for the kits comes to \$2.65 each and shipping for the quilts comes to \$2.25 each. The number of kits and quilts varies each year, but we currently have many of each completed and ready to go. We enjoy the work of putting these items together knowing they will help comfort someone who has lost most everything. Thank you for your help with this important ministry.

Martin Luther said, “Music is one of the fairest and most glorious gifts of God, to which Satan is a bitter enemy; for it removes from the heart the weight of sorrow and the fascination of evil thoughts. . . . If the devil suggests cares or sad thoughts, then defend yourself with a will and say: ‘Get out, devil. I must now sing and play to my Lord Christ.’ Take some good fellows and sing the devil down until you learn to despise him. . . . Next to the Word of God, music deserves the highest praise.”

You don’t have to be a trained musician to make a joyful noise to God, although each person’s voice and ear can be trained for improvement. When people hear joyful singing coming from you, it will encourage them, heal your own heart, and gladden God’s to receive your worship in this personal and emotional way.

When I looked online to order it I discovered it also has a study guide. I ordered that too. The book is meant to be a book study so why not get the study guide. Upon reading the study guide there was mention of an answer guide so I downloaded that and printed it out to go along with the study guide. I've been researching the information about the book and decided to put it out to everyone as a newsletter article. The book and study guide will be on display in the library if anyone is interested. I have not read it yet, but am planning to do so in the near future.

This information is taken from the book summary "The Screwtape Letters" by C.S. Lewis. The book provides unique insight into the battles that are being waged in the spiritual world.
