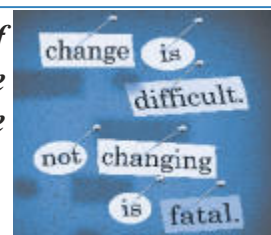

Immanuel-Trinity is in transition!

Everything is up in the air! Nothing will ever be the same! What are we going to do? In this season of transition, I believe God has been gracious to give us this opportunity to reshape our perspectives and priorities as we lean into changes in front of us. We are being challenged again to rely on Jesus, and Jesus alone, to shape the future of our church. Are we open to the Word of God? Are we ready to respond in word and action to our Pentecost mandate to share the Good News of Jesus Christ to all for whom we come in contact?

From his book *"When Heaven Invades Earth"* Pastor Bill Johnson shares,

*"Wouldn't it be wonderful to have churches so explosive in the supernatural that we would have to find ways to calm them down? That's what Paul had to do with the Corinthian church. The instructions about the gifts of the Spirit were given to a people who had so much they needed to organize it. 'Let everything be done decently and in good order' (1 Cor. 14:40) You can't organize what you don't have. Everything has to be done before you can add a structure to make it more effective. Order is a poor substitute for power. But if you have much power, you'll need good order. Only in that case will order add a new dimension to the role of power in the Church.*

*Each move of God has been followed by another, just to restore what was forfeited and forgotten. And we still haven't arrived to the standard that they attained, let alone surpassed it. Yet, not even the early Church fulfilled God's full intention for His people. That privilege was reserved for those in the last leg of the race. It is our destiny.*

*As wonderful as our spiritual roots are, they are insufficient. What was good for **yesterday** is deficient for **today**. It's not that everything must change for us to flow with what God is saying and doing. It's just that we make too many assumptions about the rightness of what presently exists. Those assumptions blind us to the revelations still contained in Scripture. In reality, what we think of as the normal Christian life cannot hold the weight of what God is about to do. Our wineskins must change. There is very little of what we now know as Church life that will remain untouched in the next ten years.*

I pray for a move of God to fall upon Immanuel-Trinity. I believe that will mean that we will look very different tomorrow from what we do today. We will look even more different 5 years from now. How different, that is up to God. Our challenge is to be open to the opportunities that God places before us. Our world has changed. The needs of our community have changed. We as a people of God have changed. God's love and power haven't changed. Let us tell our stories about that love to a new generation of believers. Let us tell our God stories to those who need the loving touch of God in their circumstances. There is no Challenge bigger than God's Spirit in our midst. Let us be about God's business.

Dear Members of Immanuel-Trinity Lutheran Church,

Since January 2019 each month a Council Member has written an article for "The Beacon" addressing concerns for the future viability of Immanuel-Trinity Lutheran Church

**In January, Shar Raube** wrote: "We as members need to continue this great church. In order for our church community to grow, we need every member to contribute -time, talent and treasure!

**In February, Amy Bertram** wrote, "Immanuel-Trinity's future depends on all of us. Let's revitalize our passion for God and Immanuel-Trinity. We all have a responsibility to our church and can contribute in many ways, small and large. I am I-T. You are I-T. We are I-T.

**In March, Becky Skorik**, lamented the response to this year's time and talent inventory results.

"Thank you for the 32 people who responded out of a church of over 200 who regularly worship." My next question for every one who is a member. What ministries, outreach or projects do we cut out first?

**In March** a concerned member addressed concerns regarding the fact that the Bleck Bequest is now almost entirely spent, and the sad reality of the situation is becoming clear. At the Annual meeting only 70 members out of a 691 member congregation voted to begin taking money from the Endowment restricted fund for up to \$15,000 a month.

**In the April Newsletter Council Member Aric Hamburg** wrote an article entitled "**Should I dare ask, What Might be Next for IT?**

*"I am currently serving the last year of my final term on our congregational council and cannot tell you how many countless hours have been spent discussing our financial issues and brainstorming ideas to help us in our financial burdens. Over the past 4 years, we've had months where it looked like we might be making progress and maybe we were finally headed down a sustainable path. But then the summer slump would hit when giving takes a significant downturn and we'd be right back to taking the full amount from the bequest."*

The Council, at times, has to make difficult and unpopular decisions that have a direct effect on the long term viability of Immanuel-Trinity as a congregation. At a special council meeting held on May 1, 2019, the following Council Members Present: Bob Greenwood, Gary Dilling, Shar Raube, Aric Hamburg, Amy Bertram, Lori Jurgensmier, Travis Moser, Becky Skorik, Marie Scannell, and June Bahr. Absent; Scott Roltgen (Council members John de Montmollin and Pastor Tom Meyer, were not eligible to vote on financial issues or staffing issues) The following actions were taken.

1. Motion made to eliminate the Youth Director Position and not to rehire at this time.  
MSC with a unanimous vote of the Council present.

2. Motion to eliminate the Music Director position on May 1st. Unpaid vacation and severance package would be given and insurance paid until the end of May, 2019. MSC with a unanimous vote of the Council present.

The Council liaisons to the following ministries; CAFÉ, Facility Care, Worship Action Team, Faith Nurture (Education), Fellowship/Outreach, Stewardship Team, Faith in Action team, and Communication Action team will need to evaluate for effectiveness to see if the need and desire to continue that function is there. None of these decisions were made lightly, if you have other questions or concerns during this time of transition, please feel free to come to the next Council meeting and share those concerns at the Member Concerns portion of the Meeting.

## Chocolate News June, 2019

You may have noticed that the self-service boxes of Seroogy's candy bars have disappeared near the mailboxes and by the church offices. We have officially closed our debt retirement project.

As promised, here is the final accounting of our activities since our last newsletter article. On December 11, 2018, we made a payment of \$1000 and on May 6, 2019, we were able to make a payment of \$1030 each toward Immanuel-Trinity's debt retirement. That brings our collection of fundraising, memorials, and donations total to \$32,634.00. We are grateful to all who contributed to our project, and we are amazed at what all of us have accomplished.

Unfortunately, our congregation still has a large amount of debt to retire, but if we each step up and contribute, with God's help we can accomplish great things. We will gain much more than candy bars and coffee. When we go on vacation, we still have bills to pay at home and so does Immanuel-Trinity.

Since it is summer and vacation is upon us. I will mention one last place of interest to visit. Located in southwestern Vermont is the Chocolatorium in East Arlington, VT. They have displays on chocolate, taste testing and a movie. A person can make his own chocolate bar for \$6. The Chocolatorium is home to Cocoa the world's largest teddy bear. 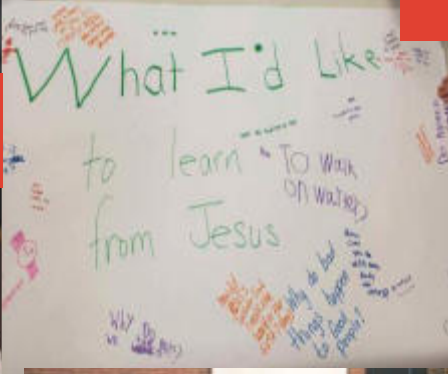

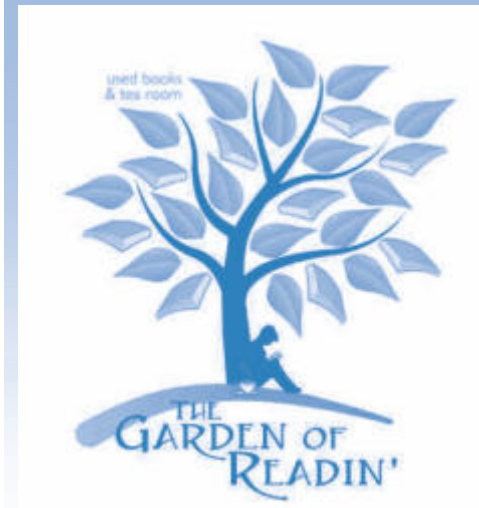
