

Dear Partners in Discipleship

I want to share a true story with you..... Kyle chauffeured his grandma in her '54 Mercury Monterey down the dusty, gravel road on the way to see the old homestead and reminisce a bit with her. She was glad for the company. Ahead, a flurry of fuzz swept across the road and tumbled into the high grass. "I'm going to stop and see what that was," said he. "Skunks," said she, "we don't need to be stopping for skunks just today." "I wonder . . ." said he. He stopped and got out. "Now you're embarrassing me. What are the neighbors going to think if we stop to chase skunks? If you get sprayed, you're walking back to town." Kittens. Seven of them. Scrawny, bordering on emaciated. No mother in sight. Then it just happened, before he even thought of how it would look to the old woman born on the prairie in the 1800s. He started to meow like an idiot in broad daylight. "Now, there's no



meow like an idiot in broad daylight. "Now, there's no need to do any of that," said she. "They probably have fleas anyway. Don't you dare bring them into my car." But he continued. Calling. Calling. As mother-cat-like as he could. Four came; three escaped. Four lived to be reunited with the worried mama cat and her boy at the farmhouse almost a mile away. Three almost certainly perished.

Almost two thousand years earlier . . . Another time. Another call. This one from the cross, and then from the open tomb. A call as loving and recognizable as he could make it, though some watched him and mocked. The call echoed through many centuries of time. Some mocked. Some came. Some escaped. The call is clear to this day. A call to faith in the Savior who alone is the way, the truth, and the life. Some mock, some come, some escape. But to those who come, who answer the call, he is not content to greet them from afar. He draws them close. Closer. And why not? He gave his life for them, so is it any wonder that he wants to give them his very heart, a noble heart for living with the highest of principles? They live principled lives when they can, when they notice that they have a choice. But for the most part they are happy just to have enough resources to get through the day. Live smarter? Live by divine principles? A luxury most days, they say. "A luxury, indeed," the Savior says, "and I want your lives to be luxurious with the richness of my Spirit . . . so for today, for now, let my word dwell in you richly, and I will show you the riches of a good life, a smart life, a principled life. A life that is marked by caring for others, a life of commitment in the sharing of the gifts I have first given you, the gift of your self, the gift of time each day of your life, the gift of all that you have and call your own. I gave my life for you, what will you give back in return?


Christian Education is underway!

Learn how to listen. Listen with your heart. How many times when someone is talking to you are really listening to what they are saying or are you thinking about what your want to say when they are done talking. The definition of a leader is one who listens to ones he is leading. President Woodrow



Wilson once said, "*The ear of a leader must ring with the voices of the people*." Train yourself to listen for people's feelings not just their ideas. All you have to do is listen "between the lines" for cues that will tell you how others feel. Focus on the individual not just the ideas being expressed. What most people really want is to be listened to. Being full of yourself leaves little room for input from others. That is why God gave you two ears and only one mouth so we can listen
